Instead of solving the problem, the Saskatchewan government and the Saskatchewan Association of Health Organizations (SAHO) are making those shortages worse.

Saskatchewan's 25,000 health care providers – working in home care, acute care, nursing homes, public health – have been seeking a fair contract from SAHO and the government for more than two years. But the government and SAHO are refusing to negotiate. SAHO has walked away from the bargaining table twice.

They're also playing favourites, giving some health workers much better treatment than others. For example, one group of health care workers receives a premium for weekend work that is more than double what health care providers like Jan Kapacila receive. Why is the time some health care providers spend with their families worth so much less?

Only a fair deal will.

It's time SAHO and the government negotiated one.
